 a beautiful set of Stoddard's Lectures
 in 14 volumes. And Mourio's Encyclopedic
 of Education, and the exchange of
 our old International Encyclopedic for
 the new set.

No actual count can be kept of the
 reference books which have been in
 daily use in the library for study and
 research by the students and especially
 by the pupils of the public schools, showing
 that Boardman Reference Library is a
 valuable part of our Free Public Library.
